On Tuesday, August 20th, our monthly meeting will consist of a return trip to the Museum of the Shenandoah Valley to view the exhibit Gardens of Glass: The Art of Craig Mitchell Smith. We will explore some of the seven-acre MSV gardens and have the opportunity to discover 30 larger-than-life glass sculptures. The MSV was designed as a space where the art, history, and culture of the Shenandoah Vallev could be interpreted. The Museum sits on land originally claimed by Winchester founder James Wood in 1735. The Museum's landscape is the largest green space in the city of Winchester and the Glen Burnie House, and its surrounding gardens remain an important part of this year-round regional history complex.
