a surprise package from hybridizer Larry Wier. If you don't know his flowers, you really should. As



# **Planting your Bulbs**

Some general guidelines for growing beautiful daffodils in your garden from the American Daffodil Society website (https://daffodilusa.org/)

Plant the bulbs when grounds have cooled. In the Mid-Atlantic that is around Mid-October.

Choose a well-drained, sunny place. Hillsides and raised beds are best. DRAINAGE is the key. Spade at least twelve inches deep. Improve your clay with well-rotted compost, soil amendment, or planting mix and raise the bed. Slightly acidic soil is best, so you might add soil sulfur if you have alkaline soil....

During the soil preparation, a complete fertilizer, low in nitrogen, (3 -6-6 or 5-10-10) should be worked in (about 1/4 cup per square foot). Be sure the fertilizer does not come in direct contact with the bulbs. Plant your daffodils so that their top (pointed end) is at least two times as deep as the bulb is high (top of a 2" bulb is 4" deep). Exactness isn't crucial; they'll adjust. Plant bulbs deeper in sandy soil than in clay.... Daffodils need lots of water while they are growing. Water immediately after planting and keep them moist until the rains come. Continue watering for three weeks or so after blooming time; then stop watering..."

# **Washington Daffodil Society General Meeting Minutes**

June 17, 2023

The June 17, 2023, meeting of the Washington Daffodil Society was held at the Merrifield Community Center, Falls Church.

Board Members Present: Mary Anne Barton, Karen Cogar, Kathy Welsh, Glenna Graves, Lea Shuba, Connie Richards, Janet Hickman, Anita Brown, Kaki Power. Others present: Bob and Lina Huesmann, Robert and Mary Darling, Mary Schwegler, Wes Graves, and Genie Applegate.

President Mary Anne Barton called the meeting to order at 11:10 AM. The minutes were approved as stated in the Spring 2023 Newsletter. Mary Anne recognized Bob Huesmann for his continued contributions to the WDS for many years. She also thanked Clay Higgins for the many photos of our Daffodil Show as posted in the Newsletter.

Treasurer's report – Mary Anne distributed the report as treasurer Tricia Goins was not present.

Discussion of the bulb order and remaining expenses to some of the bulb growers as their bills have not yet been received. There were 61 orders placed this year and 105 different cultivars were offered. It was noted the WDS had voted last meeting to donate \$1000.00 to the ADS technology fund which supports daffnet, daffseek etc. Membership income from dues was \$1,505.00 It was noted, post meeting, that Karen Cogar notified she has paid \$414.00 Insurance renewal to the Hartford Insurance Co. She has been reimbursed by Treasurer. Concerning our show expense, it runs approximately \$5000 per year. This is usually covered by our bulb sales and auction. Undetermined- as of yet- but it is estimated that the net proceeds from the 2022 bulb sales were approximately \$8000.

Mary Anne Barton agreed to research the cost of a "Banana Flag" for use at our Daffodil meetings to show location and allow more visible entrance to meeting locations.

Glenna Graves, Nominating Chair, will be soliciting members to serve as Directors for the WDS 2024-2026. Please give this your consideration when asked. If you would like to volunteer, please call Glenna, 540-434-8587.

The Fall meeting and bulb exchange will be held at the same location of Trinity United Methodist Church in Mc Lean---Saturday, October 28<sup>th</sup>, 2023. Bring your bulbs to exchange as well as participate in the live auction. Live Auction proceeds will be donated to the 2024 Convention.

Mary Anne handed out numbers for the plant exchange at the end of the meeting.

There was much discussion concerning the maintenance of the WDS shed at Merrifield Garden Center in Fair Oaks. Mary Anne and Kathy visited the site and said the shed is in very bad shape. Partial siding needs to be replaced as well as painting and a new roof. Kathy will meet with a repair man to get an estimate for all needed repairs as well as painting of the WDS properties.

The remainder of the meeting was a discussion of the ADS Convention to be hosted by the Mid-Atlantic Region on April 10-13, 2024, at the Hyatt Regency Dulles Hotel.

## WDS Properties:

A decision was made to cut off the tops of the tall risers to be the same height as the "minis' risers". Reason: They are too heavy for members to handle, some are warped, storage is difficult. Kathy will check with the repairman for the feasibility of cutting and as well as the cost of having the risers painted. They have not been repaired or painted in over 20 years.

The wooden blocks – many need to be painted –possibly have a paint day. They also need to be cleaned. Tubes for stems – need cleaning and we also need proper tube size for the miniatures.

Kathy will talk to Mitch Carney about possible borrowing of saltshakers or small tubes from the Chambersburg Club as well as single stem blocks.

The cost of the repairs to our properties would come from our WDS treasury. It would not be considered a Convention expense.

Kathy and Karen then presented an estimated Budget for the ADS Convention. Considering everything from food, buses, tours, printing, renting tables, truck rental for transporting properties to show, and many other things a basic estimate could be in the \$50,000.00 range or more.

Also, a list of Convention Chairs for all committees was given out:

Kathy Welsh and Karen Cogar are Convention Chairmen, Kirby Fong is the Show Chairman, Some of the other chairs are Publicity, Publications, Photography, Boutique, Website, Newcomers Reception, Judges, Clerks, Tabulation, Tours, Design, Speakers, Awards and others.

Also distributed was a Schedule of Events starting on Wednesday April 9<sup>th</sup> – room available for student judges flower identification study. April 10- ADS Judges School III; Registration, Horticulture and Design entries, Newcomers Reception and Executive and Finance Committee meeting. April 11- 12:00am t0 9:30AM - Daffodil staging, Judging, Optional tour, Boutique, Live Bulb Auction, Dinner- General Membership meeting and Awards presentation.

Friday there will be educational meetings/speakers, Judges refresher, tour.

Saturday – Garden tour and educational meetings

Sunday – those attending the World Daffodil Convention in Netherlands and Northern Ireland will leave. This is a very abbreviated list of activities.

Robert Darling was very pleased to announce committee members for the Photography Show. Consideration for possible class for recognition of Daffodil Growers in the Mid-Atlantic Region, as well as a class recognizing prominent daffodil people in the Region for the past 70 years.

## Photography Stand Properties-

It was voted that the WDS will have new photography stands made with approximate cost in \$600 range. Possibly we could also borrow the stands used at the Gettysburg Convention 2022. Karen Cogar made the motion for Robert Darling to check with the group that made the Gettysburg stands to see if they would make some for WDS. Janet Hickman seconded the motion.

Fund Raising -

We will need the full participation of all the Mid Atlantic Societies to support the cost of the convention. Discussion followed as to possible means of fund raising.

Our meeting adjourned at 1:30 pm., A wonderful box lunch was enjoyed, plants were exchanged, and each person received a 15% discount coupon from Merrifield Garden Center to apply to any purchases made in the Garden Center.


